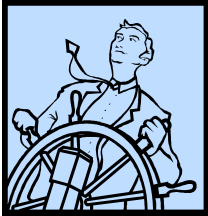

## Funeral

**Deep Six or Davy Jones Locker**, terms we Sailors all know. Recently, I've had some inquires about placing "shipmate" ashes/urn on the Muliphen Reef. After some research, I found a Certified Diver working at the UDT/SEAL Museum. They are willing to take the Ashes/Urn of our Shipmates to their final resting spot in the Bridge area of the Muliphen. Lisa Fulton and her husband have graciously offered their services, for the small fee of renting the boat. Here is the scenario. The Ashes/Urn must be brought to the Fort Pierce, FL docks and handed to the Diver, (if family members wishes to escort the Ashes, that would be OK). Plan on a 5 hour day for this trip. The trip to the Muliphen Reef is about 2 hours (about 12-15 miles from Fort Pierce). The actual dive and photographs will take about an hour, The return trip back will take 2 hours. The dive/memorial service will only be conducted during the calm water season of July and August. Therefore, start your preparation in June for transporting the Urn to the area. Contact me for questions about Ashes placement.



### Ship's Store:

As I've mentioned in the past our ship's store may soon close. However; I am presently negotiating with one of the shipmates to take it over. If the ship's store reopens, the information will be published on the website and new Storekeeper's name revealed.



### Unknown addresses of Shipmates

The website is updated on a regular basis with status reports of former shipmates. As I research the names, I check for a current address or obituary. Although I don't publish current addresses, you can tell if I have one in my records, because I will put the "**City and State**" on the website. Anything listed as "**Unknown**" means I have nothing on the shipmate (no current address or obituary).

I'm asking you to visit the website and scan through the crews list. The list is getting very long, it is listed by Year, then Alphabetical by last name. If you know any of the shipmates on the list, Deceased or Alive, please contact me with the information.

I appreciate all the researchers I can get and I'll publish a new address book in a few months.

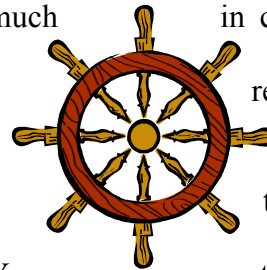
### Donations

Does everyone remember this photo?



**Hint:** Friday, February 23, 1945 at around 1:00 PM. the small island of Iwo Jima. \_ \_ \_

Some of us will remember it from the history books, movies and TV History videos, but only a few of our living shipmates were there and saw it first hand..

USS Muliphen Seaman 1st class **Cyril H. Feldman**, was there, He met (had an encounter) with the famous photographer. Joseph Rosenthal. He is the Russian born Jew (later turned Catholic) Pulitzer prize winning photographer. As fate would have it, the now famous Associated Press (AP) photographer would soon meet up with Seaman 1st class Feldman. They had a brief encounter, while on a landing craft headed to Iwo Jima. Shipmate Feldman, observed a name tag on the Army type uniform worn by Mr. Rosenthal. Cyril commended Mr. Rosenthal for being a fellow Jew in the mist of this great battle. Mr. Rosenthal thanked him but made it clear that he was no longer Jewish, but now a Catholic. Later during the battle for Iwo Jima, Mr. Rosenthal would snap the sequence of pictures that would go down in history. Today, Seaman 1st Class, Cyril Feldman is alive and well, living in West Bloomfield, MI (outside of Detroit). He sends his best regards to all the shipmates of the USS Muliphen.

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If you or a family member have an interesting story about yourself or another shipmate, (keep it clean we have censors and loose lips sink ships). Please share it with us. I'll be happy to add your story to the next newsletter. Sometime the funniest things happened off ship (on liberty) and they can be added too.

**Effective July 7, 2014: VA is changing its monetary burial benefits regulations to simplify the program and pay eligible survivors more quickly and efficiently. These regulations will authorize VA to pay, without a written application, most eligible surviving spouses basic monetary burial benefits at the maximum amount authorized in law through automated systems rather than reimbursing them for actual costs incurred.**

- **Under the current regulations, VA pays for burial and funeral expenses on a reimbursement basis. This requires survivors to submit receipts for relatively small one-time payments that VA generally pays at the maximum amount permitted by law.**
- **The new burial regulations will permit VA to pay, at a flat rate, for burial and plot or interment allowances. This new laws enables the VA to make an automate payment of burial benefits to most eligible surviving spouses and more efficiently process other burial benefit claims.**

- The burial allowance for a non-service-connected death is \$300, and \$2,000 for a death connected to military service.
