INTERNATIONAL NEWS

-INDONESIAN WAR-

AN EXTREMIST INDONESIAN RADIO STATION CALLED YESTER-DAY FOR "WAR ON THE BRITISH", AND ASKED INDONESIAN YOUTHS TO REINFORCE THE RANKS OF HARD PRESSED NATIVE NATIONAL-ISTS AT SUMARAN, SCENE OF THE LATEST OUTBREAK IN TROUBLED JAVA.

A DISPATCH FROM EMBATTLED SURABIA SAID THE BRITISH REPORTED EVIDENCE THAT THE INDONESIANS WERE ENDEAVORING TO MANUFACTURE BOMBS AND WEAPONS THERE ON A SMALL SCALE.

SPORATIC FIGHTING CONTINUED IN BATAVIA. THE BRITISH COMMUNIQUE SAID THE SITUATION IN CENTRAL JAVA "GIVES CAUSE FOR ANXIETY, IN VIEW OF THE EXTREMELY AGGRESSIVE LOCAL EXTREMEISTS, BOTHIN SEMERANG AND JOLACARIA."

INDONESIANS CONT'D

THE EXTREMISTS BROADCASTS, BY A STATION IN THE INTERIOR OF JAVA, CAME AFTER PREMIER SJAHRIR, OF THE UNRECOGNIZED INDONESIAN REPUBLIC, RUSHED A THREE MAN COMMITTEE TO SURABIA TO INVESTIGATE THE FIGHTING, IN THE HOPE OF FINDING A SOLUTION.

-SERIOUS SITUATION FOR U.S.-

UNITED STATES UNDER-SECRETARY OF THE NAVY, ARTIMUS GATES, WHO IS NOW IN CSING TAO, CONFERRING WITH ADMIRAL BARBY AND MAJOR GENERAL LEMUAL SHEPART, COMMANDER OF THE SIXTH MARINE DIVISION, DECLARED YESTERDAY THAT THE AMER-ICAN PUBLIC GENERALLY, "IS NOT AWARE OF THE SERIOUS SITUATION IN CHINA, AND THE POSSIBILITY OF INVOLVEMENT OF UNITED STATES FORCES."

MEANWHILE, A COMMUNIST PRESS RELEASE FROM YANAN DE-NIED A UNITED PRESS DISPATCH SAYING THAT COMMUNIST RESERVES HAD LANDED AT RUSSIAN HELD DAIREN AND PORT ARTHUR ON THEIR WAY TO MANCHURIA, BUT CHINESE MILITARY GOVERNMENT MILITARY AND FOREIGN SOURCES ALLEGED THE REPORT WAS TRUE.

-ANOTHER HARI KARI-

BARON GENERAL HONJO HAS KILLED HIMSELF IN THE TRADIT-IONAL HARI KARI, BECAUSE, HE SAID IN A NOTE, "I CANNOT ENDURE AS A SOLDIER, OF OUR COUNTRY TO APPEAR BEFORE A COURT OF ALLIED POWERS."

THE MAN WHOM SUPREME HEADQUARTERS DESCRIBED AS THE "RINGLEADER OF THE JAPANESE WAR-LORDS," SUICIDED LESS THAT TWENTY FOUR HOURS AFTER HE WAS NAMED ON THE NEW LIST OF "WANTED MEN", WITH ORDERS FROM GENERAL MAC ARTHUR'S HEADQUARTERS TO BE TURNED IN AT SUGAMO PRISON CAMP.

STATESIDE NEWS:

PRESIDENT TRUMAN HAS URGED CONGRESS TO ADOPT A COMPULSORY HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAME, GUARANTEEING PROPER MEDICAL CARE DOR EVERY AMERICAN.

ALL PERSONS WHO WORK FOR A LIVING, AND THEIR DE-PENDENTS WOULD BE COVERED, UNDER A SYSTEM OF REQUIRED PRE-PAYMENT OF ALL MEDICAL COSTS.

STATESIDE NEWS CONT'D

NEEDY PERSONS, AND OTHER GROUPS, WOULD BE INCLUDED THROUGH APPROPRIATE PREMIUMS PAID EOR THEM BY PUBLIC AGENCY'S.

MEDICAL EXPENSES WOULD BE PAID OUT OF A HEALTH FUND, BUILT UP NATIONALLY - PARTLY THROUGH HEALTH INSURANCE PREMIUMS, WHICH WOULD BE PAID BY INCREASING SOCIAL SECURITY TAX, AND PARTLY FROM GENERAL REVENUES-THE AMOUNT IN EACH CASE TO BE DECIDED BY CONGRESS.

BILLS IMMEDIATELY WERE INTRODUCED IN THE HOUSE AND SENATE TO CARRY OUT THE PLAN.

TWICE IN HIS MESSAGE, MR. TRUMAN EMPHASIZED THAT HIS INSURANCE PLAN DOES NOT MEAN SOCIALIZED MEDICINE.

"SOCIALIZED MEDICINE MEANS THAT ALL DOCTORS WORK AS EMPLOYEES OF THE GOVERNMENT. THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WANT NO SUCH SYSTEM, AND NO SUCH SYSTEM IS HERE PROPOSED," THE PRESIDENT SAID.

"UNDER THE PLAN I SUGGEST, OUR PEOPLE WOULD CONTINUE TO GET MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL SERVICES JUST AS THEY DO NOW, ON THE BASIS OF THEIR OWN VOLUNTARY DECISIONS AND CHOICES. OUR DOCTORS AND HOSPITALS WOULD CONTINUE TO DEAL WITH DISEASE WITH THE SAME PROFESSIONAL FREEDOM AS NOW. THERE WOULD, HOWEVER, BE THIS ALL IMPORTANT DIFFERENCE: WHETHER OR NOT PATIENTS GET SERVICES THEIR NEED WOULD NOT DEPEND ON HOW MUCH THEY CAN AFFORD TO PAY AT THE TIME."

-PEARL HARBOR INVESTIGATION-

ALSO IN THE CAPITOL, THE PEARL HARBOR INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE HAS LEARNED THAT ADMIRAL OSAMI NAGANO, CHIEF OF JAPANESE NAVEL GENERAL STAFF, TESTIFIED RECENTLY AT TOKYO THAT HE ALONE DECIDED, ON NOVEMBER 3, 1941, TO ATTACK HAWAII. NAGANO'S STATEMENT WAS TAKEN DURING AN INQUIRY CONDUCTED BY SUBORDINATES OF GENERAL MAC ARTHUR, AT THE REQUEST OF THE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEE. THE TOKYO TESTIMONY HAS BEEN PLACED IN THE RECORD OF THE CURRENT HEARING.

ADMIRAL J.O. RICHARDSON, FORMER COMMANDER OF THE UNITED STATES FLEET TESTIFIED BEFORE THE 'INVESTIGATION' COMMITTEE THAT PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT SAID, IN 1940, HE

PEARL HARBOR COMMITTEE CONTID

HE DOUBTED THAT THE UNITED STATES WOULD ENTER THE WAR, THEN, EVEN IF THE JAPANESE ATTACKED THE PHILIPPINES, NETHERLANDS EAST INDIES, TAILAND, OR THE KRA KRA PENNISULA.

HE SAID MR. ROOSEVELT MADE THIS STATEMENT DURING A WHITE HOUSE LUNCHEON, IN OCTOBER OF THAT YEAR. THE PRESIDENT ADDED, HOWEVER, THAT, AS AREA OPERATIONS EXPANDED, SOONER OR LATER THE JAPANESE WOULD MAKE A MISTAKE, AND THE UNITED STATES WOULD ENTER THE WAR.

-GI'S AND LABOR DISCUSSION-

GI'S IN THE TOKYO AREALAST NIGHT HAD A CHANCE TO AIR THEIR VIEWS ON THE CONTRAVERSIAL ISSUE OF LABORS DEMAND FOR A 30 % INCREASE IN WAGES. SPONSERED BY THE AVC, AN OPEN FORUM ON LABOR WAS HELD IN THE DIECHI BUILD-ING AUDITORIUM AT 7:30 PM LAST NIGHT.

SPEAKING ON THE SUBJECT WERE TWO MEN WELL VERSED IN LABOR-MANAGEMENT RELATIONS, LT. WYMAN HICKS, A FORMER DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE ECONOMIST, AND SGT. AL GERBER, WHO HAS BEEN ACTIVE ON FERERAL GOVT. LABOR BOARDS.

THE DISCUSSION DEALT WITH THE HIGHLY CONTRAVERSIAL ISSUES OF WHETHER LABORORS TAKE HOME PAY WILL REMAIN THE SAME WHILE ITS HOURS OF WORK ARE REDUCED, AND WHETHER LABOR IS ENTITLED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE INCREASED PROFITS OF INDUSTRY.

NEW YORK CITY: - ONLY FOUR MAJOR AND FIVE MINOR FOOTBALL TEAMS WERE LEFT IN THE RANKS OF THE UNBEATEN, UNTIED FOOT-BALL MACH HES AFTLR HOLY CROSS AND ST. MARY'S WENT DOWN TO DEFEAT LAST WEEKEND. THE FOUR MAJOR TEAMS WITH UN-BLEMISTED RECORDS ARE ARMY, ALABAMA, VIRGINAL, AND OAK-LAHOMA A A M: AND THE FIVE MINOR TEAMS ARE OBERLIN, GUSTAVUS-ADOLPHUS, ARKANSAS TECH, ARIZONA AND REDLANDS. NAVY WAS IN THE UNBEATEN RANKS, BUT RECORD SHOWS ONE TIE. INDIANA CONTINUES TO TOP THE WESTERN CONFERENCE. MISSOURI IS LEADING THE BIG SIX PARADE WHILE TEXAS IS REGARDED IN THE TOP POSITION IN THE SOUTHWEST CONFERENCE. ALABAMA TOOK UNDISPUTED PUSCESSION OF THE SOUTHEAST CONFERENCE LEAGUE. CLEMSON LEADS THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE, AND IN THE PACIFIC CONFERENCE, SO. CAL AND WASHINGTON ARE TIED FOR FIRST PLACE.
